How does it differ from other forms of international intervention and assistance? •The notion of humanitarian intervention evolved, both in the writings of major thinkers and with changes in the nature and composition of the international system and international society. •In what ways does humanitarian intervention challenge state sovereignty? Under what conditions and for what purposes is the violation of state sovereignty justified? Should the forces engaged in intervention focus narrowly on protecting civilian lives from immediate danger? Or can the broader goals of regime change and nation-building be justified on humanitarian grounds as well? •Can the humanitarian intervention be seen as a disguised form of imperialism? How have its advocates responded to this concern? •Which political entities should be responsible for carrying out interventions -- individual states, alliances, or international organizations? And, who has the authority to decide when intervention is (or is not) warranted? •Under what conditions is humanitarian intervention permissible? What kinds and degrees of threats to a population justify an international response? What other criteria apply? Are interventions permissible that do not receive authorization from the United Nations Security Council? •How different theoretical approaches within international relations (such as realism, liberal internationalism, and constructivism) have framed and responded to the practice of humanitarian intervention. How this responses changed over time. How might they change in the future? •In recent years, humanitarian intervention has gained a high profile especially in popular culture. Is it true that, for instance Angelina Jolie, Hotel Rwanda or Blood Diamond have drawn the public's attention to the lawyers, doctors, and social workers striving for human rights, public health, and the security of civilians in unbearably dangerous environments? •Which international legal documents outline states' responsibilities with regards to humanitarian intervention? What are the benefits/limitations of the UN Charter regarding humanitarian intervention? •In each case, do we judge the intervention a success or failure, and how do we explain the success or failure? •Can human suffering alone can justify military intervention in another state's conflicts?

Ders hem "insani müdahale"nin teorik-tarihi açıklamalarına girecek hem de pratikteki uygulamaları ve insani müdahale yapılması gerektiği halde yapılmadığı değerlendirilebilecek örnekleri inceleyecektir.</p>	<p>This course will address the legal, historical, political and ethical questions that arise from humanitarian intervention. It will involve both theoretical explorations of the nature and prehistory of 'humanitarianism' and empirical examples of claimed 'humanitarian interventions' (such as Bosnia, Kosovo and East Timor) along with cases where it is claimed interventions should have taken place (such as Rwanda 1994) and others where humanitarianism has been combined with geo-strategic motivations.</p>
